This financial year combined of success as well as challenging

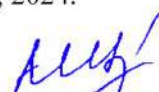

Target Population:

Our focused target groups are People with Disabilities and their Parents, Children, Adolescent, Senior Citizens, released Bonded Labour, Migrants, Returnee Migrants, Potential Migrants, Persons with Mental illness and their Caretakers, farmers, aggrieved consumers at micro level and we focused on service providers, institutions, civil society organizations, duty bearers, Networks, Federations, Media Persons at macro level in our different interventions and programmes.

Alternative Forms of Care and Support Programme for Children without Parental Care and Other Vulnerable Children

The “Alternative forms of Care and support programme for children without parental care and other vulnerable children” has launched in the month of May 2013 with the support from the Stichting Kindpostzegels Nederland. The programme is directly working with children living without adequate parental Care and other vulnerable children at the 9 Grampanchayat with an approach to ensure that the children in need of care and protection have opportunities and access to services that help them to exercise their rights to survival, development, protection and participation as well as full participation in a family-based care and community. At present the programme is continuing as “Child centered family focus programme” with community based approach. Currently the programme is being implemented intensively in Nine Grampanchayats namely Rengali, Chhakormal, Lachhipur, Khaliapali, Mayurudan and Mallikmunda under Sonapur Block of Subarnapur District and Gudvela, Deulgudi and GhunaGram Panchayat under Gudvela Block of Bolangir District in the State of Odisha. In the year 2023-2024, RARE is directly working with 50 vulnerable families and their 86 children in need of care & protection especially children without parental care, orphan and other vulnerable children. The programme has worked to improve the socio-economic status of the supported families and children with regard to care and protection at family, institution (AWC/School) and community engaging the community actively in the entire process of the programme. It is one of the key values of the programme which we are practicing that not to refer the directly target children and their families as the receivers of service rather consider and actively involve them as the partners of the programme.

Result achieved during the Period June, 2023 to March, 2024 under the programme:

1. 76 vulnerable children from 40 families provided maintenance package for continuation of education so that their retention could be ensured
2. 10 children provided one time support in terms of admission and purchase of study material so that their enrollment in higher education could be ensured
3. 50 care givers provided skillful parenting so that the health hygiene of 76 children and retention could be ensured.
4. Regular meeting with Gram Panchayat level Child Protection committee has ensured the regularization and address of children at “*A Day for Children*” Programme
5. Training to children and adolescent on Child Protection, POCSO and Online abuse has impacted more on identification of child sexual abuse and probable measure to check the abuse. Through this programme 51 children 79 adolescent could reach to replicate the matter among the peers.

6. Involvement of 73 members from Village level child protection committee has played major role in monitoring and retention of children at educational institution.
7. The training to 56 stakeholders like Teacher, AWWs, ASHA and Multipurpose Health Worker has ensured the education, hygiene maintain and protection of children
8. The district level consultation with 52 participants from PRI, Government and Non-government Sector has established rapport to joint action for the protection and rehabilitation of children.
9. Children festival has given a joyful platform to address the children issue as well as their inherent talent for 242 children of Gudvela Block
10. Observation of Girl child day and International Women's Day has impacted more to realize the existence and contribution to the society.

It is functioning at Dhobamunda, Sonepur with **32 Children** with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities as follows;

The CwIDDs are looking care for different services by 9 staff members I.e.:

1 Physiotherapist, 1 occupational therapist, 1 Special Educator, 1 Counselor, 2 Caregivers, 2 Ayas and 1 Accountant (Part time) are employed for therapy, special education, counseling and need based care of CwDs. Apart from this a driver is engaged for transportation and the General Secretary-cum-CEO of the Organization is the Monitoring in Charge of the Centre.

Observation/Celebration of different days:

At the Disha-cum-Vikaas Centre different days are being celebrated like; Birth of each children, Rakshya Bandhan, Independence Day, Ganesh Pooja, International Girl Child Day, World Cerebral Palsy Day, World Autism Day, Diwali Festival, Children Day, International Day for Persons with Disabilities, New year Celebration, Celebration of Holi, International Wheel Chair Day, Republic Day, Mental Retardation Day, World Down Syndrome Day and Saraswati Pooja. All the programme observed to create awareness among the parents and public as well as internalize the value of the day. The target group of the centre are closely involved



in the programme with cultural activities. In each programme Guest are being invited from official and social sector to encourage and interact with parents.

Besides this the staff members are also helping the administration during the special programme like; Bhima Bhoi Samarthya Sibira, training, meeting, survey, District level Exhibition and observation of different day.

Therapeutic and Rehabilitative Centre for Mentally Challenged and Socially Disadvantage Persons

Person having different type of disability like Intellectual Disability, Cerebral Palsy, Autism and Multiple disabilities are neglected more due the lack of knowledge regarding these types of disability and specific rehabilitative measures and extent of the same needed for these people. Again, the problem is worse for such people living in rural and backward area where the special service for them is not available. Hence to cater the need of these categories of Persons with Disability we are implementing programme titled **“Therapeutic and Rehabilitative centre for Mentally Challenged and Socially Disadvantage Person”** for the children with **Autism, Intellectual Disability, Cerebral Palsy and Multiple Disabilities** with the financial support from Department of Social Security and Empowerment for PWDs Govt. of Odisha, with all required aids, appliances and qualified experts in the concern field.

The objective of the centre is to provide therapeutic and rehabilitative services and enhance the interpersonal and vocational skill. 99 children with disabilities avail the services on daily basis.

Achievement

- 19 numbers of children with disability having speech problem are availing services from DCTC. Children are able to speak
- 95 CWDs availing therapeutic and special education services
- 56 CWDs availing rehabilitative services like training on ADLs and special education. 22 have doing their ADLs without support and 34 have with support.
- DCTC have its own multidimensional activities to create a platform for CWD for their inclusive development. The Parents are getting platform to enhance their knowledge on disabilities and process of rehabilitation.
- The CWDs are availing therapeutic and rehabilitative services in a daily basis. Different types of activities has been conducted such as creative fest, inclusive sports, vocational training for social inclusion and economic rehabilitation.
- A Van has been moving named “Bhinakshyama Seva O Sahayata Express” to the villages in every Saturday. The objective of the express is to disseminate the information on DCTC, early identification of CWDs and provide therapeutic services at door step.
- 75% parents are doing exercise at home and support their child in the rehabilitative process.
- Due to awareness meeting and mobile van Services local health service provider and doctors are referring the child to the centre for therapeutic and rehabilitative services.

BHINNAKSHYAMA SEVA O SAHAYATA EXPRESS

Children with Disabilities are subject to multiple deprivations and limited opportunities in several dimensions of their lives. Their families and caregivers also go through lot of stress and challenges in having a person with disability due to unavailability of therapeutic and rehabilitation services. People living in rural India are unaware about disability and their rehabilitation mainly children with cerebral Palsy, Mental Retardation, Autism and multiple disability.

To cater the need of the children with Intellectual Disability, Cerebral Palsy, Multiple Disabilities and Autism RARE initiates a Mobile Van Service named BHINAKHAMA SEVA O SAHAYATA EXPRESS. The objective of the initiation is

- To identify the CwDs at earliest
- To create awareness
- To create a system of Referral services
- To promote inclusiveness
- To facilitate door steep rehabilitation services
- To create a network with village service provider

Bhinnakshama Seva O Sahayata Express started its journey to serve the Children with Disability on 10th March 2018. Every Saturday it's reached a village and does the following activities.

Activities Undertaken

- Meeting with Aganwadi Workers, ASHA and visiting school for identification of children with disability
- Public meeting for Awareness creation
- Home visit to the families of CwDs
- Providing counseling services
- Providing Occupational and Physiotherapy services
- Providing need based referral services

Achievement

- 30 children at Kantamal and 37 children at Sonapur identified and counseled them to access the Therapeutic Intervention Centre.
- In the financial year 4 awareness meeting have been conducted with 100 participant from parent, senior citizen, AWWs, ASHAs, Student of school & colleges and PRI members were involved
- 17 villages with 17 numbers of awareness meeting could organized at Sonapur and at Kantamal 4 village covered with 4 awareness meeting.
- Home based physiotherapy and rehabilitation therapy provided to 4 children with MR and CP and counselled them to attend the Day Care Centre regularly.
- 13 parents are aware on services available in the locality and different govt. Provisions for person with disability.
- 22 persons got disability certificate with the support of Bhinnakshama Seva O Sahayata Express.

COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (Comprehensive Community Care and Reintegration of Persons with Mental Illness)

RARE has been working on Community Mental Health and Development Programme since 2008 in Subarnapur District with the Support of Basic Needs India, Bangaluru. The programme aims at improved human rights of People with mental illness, reduced stigma and discrimination in community and resource enhancement of all stakeholders. The Programme is being implemented in Birmaharajpur Block of Subarnapur District, targeting 750 Persons living with mental illness. 15 Community Lady Volunteers are engaged in the process for identification, facilitating the process of treatment & access to entitlement; provide psychosocial education and referral services to PWMIs. On the other hand, periodical meeting have been conducted to activate the local health service provider such as ASHA, ANM and AWW on mental health to identify and provide referral services. The launching of the

programme was 08.04.2022 at the Block conference Hall, Birmaharajpur in the presence of SDPO, BDO, ADPHO, District Mental Health team, BPM of SDH, ABEO, President and Secretary of Block level Sarapanch Association, ASHA, AWWs, Teacher, Media and Civil Society Organization were actively participated with the care taker of PWMIs.

Key Achievements

- 783 persons with Mental Illness identified with the cooperation of Society
- 783 PWMI and their caregiver have been provided psychosocial education
- 588 under treatment and medicine from 411 Government and 177 at Private Hospital.
- 102 PWMI recovered and not in medication
- 327 PWMI availed Certificate and pension.
- 312 families covered under housing and old age pension
- 632 PWMI showed improvement in ADLs activities.
- 435 PWMI Social behavior improved.
- 426 PWMI involved in small household activities like, cleaning, gardening, cooking, decorating etc.
- 305 PWMIs are involved in small income generation activities like wage earning, kitchen garden, business, photography and goat & sheep rearing.
- 15 family support group have been formed and regular meeting are going on for strengthening
- We conducted 754 community awareness meetings at schools, colleges, and with SHG, ASHA, AWW and PRI members at the village level, successfully raising mental health awareness among 17,730 people.
- 1186 SHG members, 103 teachers, 393 PRI members, 111 ASHAs and 293 AWWs, 11 ANMs, are involved in Identification referrals and follow up process.
- 48 individuals support of INR. 4,000 rupees each for different trades such as goat rearing, vegetable cultivation, poultry farming and Dairy farming, etc. Everyone has continuing their trade and they are involving PWMIs in their work.
- Due to Block-level networking meetings with government officials the process of treatment, provision of medicine and inclusion under social security scheme has increased in the Block. The media personnel also focusing on the issue for the better services for persons with Mental Illness.
- On 10th October, 2023, observed World Mental Health Day at the Block Conference Hall in Birmaharajpur. Additionally, rally was organized at the Panchayat level to raise awareness about mental health among the general public.
- On 22nd February 2024, a State Level Consultation meeting was organized by Basic Needs India in collaboration with State Mental Health Unit, SCB, Cuttack involving official from various department like SSEPD, Agriculture, Horticulture and Fishery. RARE presented the concerns, such as the appointment of psychiatrists, non availability of medicines and treatment through the e-Sanjeevani platform. As a result, treatment is now being facilitated via e-Sanjeevani, 75% Medicines are available at SDHH and psychiatrists are visiting the District Head Quarter Hospital once in a month.
- On 23rd March 2024, a Block level meeting of FSG federation was held with leaders from all the panchayat FSGs, where a core committee of 5 members was formed. This committee will communicate all grievances from Block administration to the State Government.

From Addiction to Recovery: The Transformation of Raju Amat

Introduction:

Raju Amat is a 30 years old person with mental illness of Village Tithipali under Ufula Gram Panchayat of Birmaharajpur under Subarnapur District, Odisha.

Early condition -

The family of Raju Amat consists of 6 members' i.e. Elderly mother, sister, two elder brother, sister-in-law, and Raju himself. Raju was living happily with his family, taking care of various household tasks like farming, grazing cattle, and other minor chores. He has completed up to 5th grade in the village school. In April 2008, during a village festival, some intoxicated men fought with Raju over some issue and beat him up, causing a severe head injury. He was immediately admitted to the hospital in Birmaharajpur for primary treatment and discharged home after a few days. However, Raju started using substances & alcohol with friends, and his mental condition gradually deteriorated. He couldn't perform his daily activities, wandered aimlessly, didn't sleep at night, became isolated, and stopped interacting with anyone. Keeping in mind of the condition, his family consulted at Burla hospital for treatment. He continued his medicine regularly for 4 months and was discontinued just after the death of his father. Later on the family did not pay much attention for Raju's treatment and it became critical to his symptoms. He started wandering aimlessly and not coming back to house so many days.



RARE Interventions -

In 2022, when the Community Mental Health Project started in Birmaharajpur Block, RARE's volunteer Parbati Chhanda identified Raju Amat on 17.4.22. At that time Raju's symptoms was so severe. He was feared by people nearby, used substances excessively, wandered outside, was wearing dirty clothes, neglected personal hygiene, and was not able to sleep. Seeing his condition, our team and volunteers tried to convince his family to resume treatment, but they had lost hope, believing he could never recover. However, after sharing the recovery story of Ganesh Sahu of a nearby village, Kanpur, the family agreed for treatment.



On 8 August 2022, Raju treated at District Headquarter Hospital, Subarnapur. His treatment continued, but no improvement was seen due to his substance use. Therefore, on 11.07.23, Raju was admitted to Nisha Nibarana Kendra, Matupali, for 3 months to help him quit substances & alcohol. He participated in yoga, prayers, games, and other activities, took his medication, and upon returning home, his substance & alcohol use had stopped. His symptoms started positive improve. The volunteers regularly followed up with him, involving him in small household tasks and ensuring he took his medication. After 8 months of regular medication and involvement in household tasks, his symptoms significantly reduced.

Present Status:

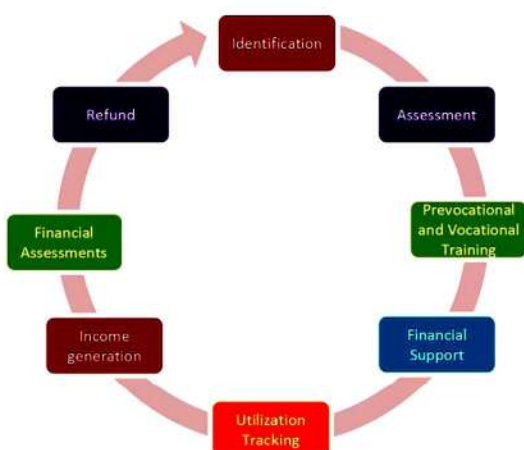
Now, he is in regular medication and member of the Family Support Group. He is going happily to graze cattle and residing in family with pleasure. Whenever we visit Raju, his mother always tells us how they had lost all hope for his recovery, and now he is completely stable. His mother as well as family expressing their gratitude to RARE's team for the support and counseling.

SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD:

RARE believes that economic rehabilitation is the root for sustainable development of individuals, families as well as communities. Taking this issue as concern RARE has taken this as cross cutting theme in the context of disabilities, mental health and child rights. We believe that livelihood is sustainable when it enables people to cope with and recover from shocks and stresses from economic or social upheavals and enhances their well-being. RARE has put effort to bring the Sustainable Livelihood development option among the families of Mental illness and PWDs as well as care giver of child without parental care.

Keeping the economic issues, RARE has been implemented various programmes under the livelihood themes with the support from Basic Needs India, Bangalore, National Foundation of India, New Delhi, Federation of Disabled Peoples and Parent's Organisation, Tarva and Stitching Kinderpostzegels Netherland, aiming to empower the families with PWDs & Mental Illness to enable them to enhance their food security, increasing their incomes and improve their quality of life through financial assistance to engage in income generation activities keeping in the mind of local market, local resources, and linkages with the government schemes & programme.

Process of Economic Rehabilitation:



Achievement:

- 15 families of children without parental Care are being provided 10000.00 each in terms of goods with a total cost of 150000.00 with the amount they have started different farm and nonfarm activities and earning at an average income of 250 to 300 per day additionally.
- 40 stabled PWMI have provided an amount of Rs. 160000/- (INR. 4000.00 each) to the stable people with mental illness with the support of their families. The stable PWMI with the support of family members are running their trade smoothly.
- **In collaboration with Action Aid Association 2 Mushroom shed are being running with a cost of 268000/- each.** In each Mushroom cultivation cum training centre 10 single women and the parents of persons with Disabilities are being covered. In group the women started Mushroom Cultivation and providing training to other likeminded women to undertake the programme.

Our aim to disseminate the information about Consumer Protection Act and aware the rural consumer for protection of their rights and get their grievance redress accordingly. To promote a strong consumer movement in rural and urban area of the district different activities on consumer issues was carried out by RARE with the support from Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare Department, Government of Odisha through the Assistance Controller of Legal Metrology office of District administration, Subarnapur.

- Observation of World Consumer Rights Day on 15th March, 2024
- Observation of National Consumer Rights Day on 24th December, 2023
- Awareness on PDS and Consumer Rights in 8 Residential ST & SC Schools of Subarnapur District with the support of District Welfare Section, Subarnapur through awareness meeting, booklet distribution and cultural programme Pala
- Counseling to consumer at Counseling centre on consumer protection, E-commerce and Mediation at RARE's counseling Centre and its redressal system
- State level consultation on consumer protection with Consumer Rights Agencies with the involvement of 65 participants from Voluntary consumer organization, Guest, resource person and other invitees.
- Awareness programme on Consumer Protection Act, 2019 with college student was organized at Subalaya college, Parameswari Higher Secondary School, Bhutiapali, Panchayat Samiti Degree College, Ulunda and Birmaharajpur Degree College during Ama Odisha Nabin Odisha programme

Key Achievement

- National Consumer Day observed on December, 2024 at Zilla Parisad Conference Hall, Subarnapur with the involvement of 75 participants.
- World Consumer rights day observed at Hotel Green Park, Subarnapur on 15th March, 2024 with the involvement of 60 participants.

CONSUMER RIGHTS ACTIVITIES IN THE STATE OF ODISHA:

About Project:-

The Research Academy for Rural Development (RARE) has partnered with Nutrition International (NI) to support the Government of India's efforts to improve access to Iodized Salt in households. As part of this collaboration, salt samples will be collected regularly from various retail and wholesale outlets, including Public Distribution System (PDS) shops, across all 30 districts, as well as from major salt production centers. These samples will then be analyzed to determine their iodine content using a method called Iodometric Titration. The findings will be recorded, and the information will be shared with relevant stakeholders to prompt necessary actions aimed at strengthening enforcement of standards. *The main objective is to encourage the widespread use of iodized salt, thus protecting vulnerable populations from Iodine Deficiency Disorders (IDD).*

Activities:-

1. Collection of Salt Sample from different region of the State through Voluntary consumer organizations
2. Testing of 600 Salt Sample in each quarter at RARE's Laboratory
3. Validation of 10% Salt sample at National Accredited Board of Laboratory
4. Consultation with personnel from District Administration like; DM & Collector, ADM-cum – District Consumer Protection Officer, President of District Consumer Dispute Redressal Forum, Civil Supplies Officer, Dy. Controller of Legal Metrology, Chief District Medical & Public Health Officer, Dy. Public Health Officer, Food Safety Officer regarding the finding of Salt Sample with a request to ensure the Iodine level in Salt Sample and ensure the statutory sampling and legal sampling
5. Consultation with Commission & Director of Food Safety, Public Health, State Institute of Consumer Awareness and FSSAI to with a request to impression upon the line department official to ensure the iodine level in the state.

MOBILE MEDICARE UNIT FOR SENIOR CITIZEN

The Mobile Medicare Unit for Senior Citizens for the service of Senior Citizens is implemented by Research Academy for Rural Enrichment (RARE) with the support of SSEPD, Govt. of Odisha and District Administration, Subarnapur. It aims to provide primary health care and counseling support to the senior citizens from unreached areas.

Preparatory activities for the programme:

Before organizing of camps a monthly plan of action plan are being submitted to DSSO, Subarnapur in consultation with Doctors to be assigned for the health care programme. After the finalization of the programme the Sarapanches, Ward members, ANM, ASHA and AWWs of the concerned Gram Panchayat are being contacted for larger awareness and access to health care programme.

Disaster Management:

Climate Change and adaptation including Emergency Response & Disaster Preparedness is a core area of RARE. In the financial year the Gram Panchayat Level Disaster Management Plan was prepared by RARE at Chiched Gram Panchayat under Gudvela Block of Bolangir District and Brahmani Gram Panchayat under Tarbha Block of Subarnapur District and both the plan was awarded by State Government.

In the financial year 2023-2024 the agreement has been made with District Administration Bolangir and Subarnapur to prepare Village level Disaster Management Plan and Gram Panchayat level Disaster Management Plan and Gram Panahayat level Disaster Management Plan. Out of 30 village at Subarnapur at 4 villages completed the formation of village development committee and at 31 villages under Bolangir District from 6 Gram Panchayat under Gudvela and Deogaon Block, 5 Gram Panchayat level Disaster Management Committee have been formed.

Organizaition Development:

RARE involved in Niranthara Classic Programme for the organization development focusing on the organization Credible and Vibrant.
